St. Marguerite d'Youville



Marguerite d'Youville suffered the loss of her father, husband and four of her six children. Once her surviving children had entered the priesthood, Marguerite and three other women founded a home for the poor in Montreal.

In 1747, they were granted a charter to operate the General Hospital of Montreal, which was in ruins and heavily in debt. They brought the hospital back to financial security, but it was destroyed by fire in 1765. The order, which had come to be known as the "Grey Nuns of Montreal," soon rebuilt.
