

Chaplain's Report

Dear Brother Knights,

There are two months of the year that seem to be the most colorful in nature. They are May and October It is no coincidence that these two months are dedicated to Our Blessed Mother - May being the "Month of Mary" and October being "the Month of the Holy Rosary."

At each monthly meeting of our council we take a few moments to check if we are carrying our rosaries with us. If not we must pay a \$2.00 fine which goes towards our council's treasury, I believe. This is a good way to encourage one another to not only have a set of rosary beads with us but also to pray them even in public, at times.

I received a recent announcement that on October 15th at 12 noon at the Majestic Gazebo in Arctic (West Warwick) there will be a public recitation of the Holy Rosary. It is sponsored by "America Needs Fatima." It will be held in over 7,000 places in the United States that day. I am told it will be offered for offenses committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary and to fervently pray for the conversion of all people of the United States of America. This can be very effective for good. You may have heard but it's good to recall that Blessed John Paul II had a great devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. He would often make it a point to pray the rosary at churches where he would visit. A man of his stature and holiness praying the rosary is quite a moving sight.

On October 16th, 2002 then Pope John Paul II promulgated (released) an "Apostolic Letter of the Supreme Pontiff to the Bishops, Clergy and Faithful called "On the Holy Rosary of the Virgin Mary". He said it is simple and profound at the same time. He said it is a effective spiritual weapon against the evils afflicting society. He says many other things in this 34 page document. Why not look it up and read part of all of it this month. It will make our carrying and praying the rosary (in private or public) a more significant prayer.
