

## Chaplain's Report

**Dear Brother Knights,** 

A month ago the season of Easter ended. Ten days before that we celebrated the Feast of the Ascension of our Lord and we heard the instructions the Apostles received, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature." Then on the feast of Pentecost we were reminded of the gift of the Holy Spirit, the fulfillment of the promise our Lord made to His Disciples and to us: "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth." (John 14:16)

The Apostles were given the Holy Spirit with His gifts of Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude (Courage), Knowledge, Piety and Fear of the Lord, to guide them. Through our Baptism and Confirmation we became followers, disciples of Our Lord. Pray with them. Turn off the television, dust off your Bible, and let your children read to you. Spend quality time with them. The time you spend with your family is worth more than the things we give them. Celebrate your children's achievements. Listen to them. As you make vacation plans, be safe and make sure Sunday Mass is in your plan.

Double STAR Award – The Supreme Council recognizes those Councils that achieve these very high requirements: The Star Council Award recognizes outstanding achievement in membership, insurance and service program activities. To be eligible to earn the Double Star Council Award, a council must qualify for the Father McGivney, Founder's, and Columbian awards.

- ☐ Submit your Service Program Personnel Report (Form 365) before August 1
- ☐ Achieve at least 200% of your Council membership quota
- ☐ Achieve at least 100% of your Council insurance quota
- ☐ Submit your Survey of Fraternal Activity (Form 1728) before January 31
- ☐ Submit Columbian Award Application (Form SP7) before June 30
- ☐ Supreme per capita must be paid
- ☐ Host or participate in a minimum of four First degree ceremonies.

#### **Vocations from our Parish**

Last month on Vocations Sunday, Father Grenon in his homily was reminiscing on the 39th anniversary of his priesthood and how he entered Our Lady of Providence seminary high school in Warwick at age 14 and then went on to St. Bernard's Seminary in Rochester NY and was ordained a priest on May 12, 1978.

He also pointed out that although there will be no priestly ordination this year, we should be proud of the three priests that have so far come out of our parish and he mentioned them by name. It occurred to me that many of our new parishioners were not aware of them, so I am submitting this photo of them with our former pastor Fr. Joseph Henry on the occasion of Father Mahar's Diaconate ordination in Rome in 2003. Their academic achievements would fill a whole page.

Since this photo was taken, Fr. Timothy Reilly is currently the Chancellor of the Diocese and Spiritual Director at Our Lady of Providence Seminary, Fr. Christopher Mahar is the Rector of OLP Seminary, and Father Michael Woolley is Pastor of St. Joseph Parish in Woonsocket and Dean of the Blackstone Valley Deanery III. Frs. Mahar and Woolley were baptized and grew up in our parish, while Fr. Reilly joined the parish as a young adult.

The Knights of Columbus are very supportive of seminarians studying for the priesthood. We have a program where for every \$500 scholarship donated to a seminarian, the Supreme Council in New Haven will reimburse the Council \$100. We usually donate one or two scholarship a year. We also close all of our meetings with a prayer for Vocations. Please join us in also praying daily for more vocations to the priesthood from our parish!

#### **Saint Thomas Moore**

Feast Day: June 22

A Martyr, (Patron of Lawyers) St. Thomas Moore was born in London in 1478. After a thorough grounding in religion and the classics, he entered Oxford to study law. Upon leaving the university he embarked on a legal career which took him to Parliament. In 1505, he married his beloved Jane Colt who bore him four children, and when she died at a young age, he married a widow, Alice Middleton, to be a mother for his young children. A reformer, this learned man numbered Bishops and scholars among his friends. By 1516 he wrote his world-famous book "Utopia". He attracted the attention of Henry VIII who appointed him to a succession of high posts and missions, and finally made him Lord Chancellor in 1529. However, he resigned in 1532, at the height of his career and reputation, when Henry persisted in holding his own opinions regarding marriage and the supremacy of the Pope.

The rest of his life was spent in writing mostly in defense of the Church. In 1534, with his close friend, St. John Fisher, he refused to render allegiance to the King as the Head of the Church of England and was confined to the Tower. Fifteen months later, and nine days after St. John Fisher's execution, he was tried and convicted of treason. He told the court that he could not go against his conscience and wished his judges that "we may yet hereafter in heaven merrily all meet together to everlasting salvation." And on the scaffold, he told the crowd of spectators that he was dying as "the King's good servant but God's first." He was beheaded on July 6, 1535. His feast day is June 22nd.

Peter was an Apostle and one of the original twelve. Although his faith faltered at times, he repented, and Jesus made Peter the first Pope. Paul was not one of the original twelve, but is still considered and Apostle. He converted cities and then wrote them letters so they would remain in the faith. Paul's letters make up some of the New Testament.


