My Brothers All I pray you and your families are well.

A while ago I was asked "what is the difference between the Knights of Columbus and other organizations or clubs?"

By Googling some of the popular groups, I will briefly try to explain some differences that I found. If you want to find more information, just Google the organizations name.

The Masons are non-Christian. In France, in 1877, the "Grand Orient" Lodge eliminated the need to believe in God or the immortality of the soul, thereby admitting atheists into their fold. The group, however, does good things for their Communities as we know.

The Lions Club is a service organization. All funds raised from the general public are used for charitable purposes. Some of the money raised goes toward projects that benefit the local community of an individual club. The lions are not allowed to discuss or debate politics and/or religion by their club members.

In 1979 qualifications for being a member of the Elks Club included being male, at least 21 years old, of sound mind and body, a citizen of the United States. Belief in a Supreme Being has been a prerequisite for membership since 1892. The word "God" was substituted for Supreme Being in 1946.

The mission of the Knights of Columbus states that it is a Catholic Fraternal Organization dedicated to promoting and conducting educational, charitable, religious and social welfare works, rendering mutual aid and assistance to sick and needy members and their families, and providing insurance products and annuities to benefit members, wives and children. The Knights also support the Catholic Church's positions on public policy issues, including various political causes, and are participants in the new evangelization.

Though many of the organizations' produce charitable works, the Knights of Columbus are the only Catholic organization that also supports our Pope, Bishops and Priests and the beliefs of the Catholic Church.

This is my brief attempt to show some differences between the Knights of Columbus and other charitable organization.

K OF C GIVE OVER \$185 MILLION TO CHARITY IN 2018



From the Catholic News Service (CNS) - In 2018, the Knights of Columbus gave \$185.7 million to charity and donated 76.7 million hours of hands-on service. The K of C announced its charitable activity over the last year in a July 31 news release, issued ahead of its annual Supreme Convention in Minneapolis, August 6-8. The Knights of Columbus, which has a membership of approximately 1.9 million, said its charitable activity is threefold: fundraising by the national organization and local Knights councils; community service; and revenues from its insurance and annuities portfolio. Using Independent Sector's valuation of a volunteer hour for 2018 - \$25.43 – the Knights' service hours came to \$1.9 billion, the release said. The value of this work combined with the year's monetary donations brings the total value of the Knights' charity to nearly \$2.1 billion. "Regardless of how or who the Knights serve, it's the chance to help those who are unable to help themselves and to be of assistance to the sick or disabled that is at the heart of what being a Knight is all about," Knights of Columbus Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson said in a statement.


