

# FROM SUPREME - FRATERNAL ACTIVITIES DURING PANDEMIC CONDITIONS

Although many jurisdictions are slowly reopening, the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic continues to present a significant risk, especially to persons who are vulnerable due to age or medical condition. Because the health and safety of our members and guests is of paramount concern, council officers and members are advised to proceed cautiously as they resume ordinary fraternal activity.

The Order's policy for fraternal activity during current pandemic conditions has been updated as follows:

- In order to prevent inadvertent spread of COVID-19 by asymptomatic carriers, travel for Knights of Columbus fraternal activity should be limited to that which is necessary and required.
- 2. Councils, assemblies and circles should use electronic tools and procedures as much as possible for fraternal activity, particularly meetings.
- 3. In-person meetings should be avoided unless personal interaction is essential and local pandemic orders and regulations permit. If you decide to resume in-person meetings, it would be ideal that they be conducted outside. Please note that you must offer all members the opportunity and means to participate remotely, so that members who are concerned about their health may avoid possible exposure to the coronavirus. Until further notice, no member may be required to attend any meeting in person.
- 4. Councils officers should exercise prudential judgment when planning to resume in-person meetings and events. They must research and obey all diocesan rules, as well as the current orders and regulations issued by civil authorities. Any activities planned at local parishes must be coordinated in advance with pastors. The Supreme Council has created an inventory of resources to assist council officers as they consider whether and when to resume in-person meetings and events. This policy is subject to change in response to new developments in the pandemic.

#### MESSAGE FROM THE SUPREME KNIGHT

Brother Knights: We are all aware of the troubling events that are occurring today, including attacks on statues of historical figures such as Abraham Lincoln, Frederick Douglass and our Order's namesake, Christopher Columbus. Statues of saints have also been vandalized, including those honoring St. Junípero Serra, St. Louis and even the Blessed Virgin Mary, and houses of worship and other religious symbols have been attacked. These are not merely attacks on statues and history. They are increasingly attacks on Catholics and people of faith.

In the late 19th century, the Knights of Columbus took its name at a time of intense anti-Catholicism. Our founding members wanted to show that Catholics played an essential role in the exploration and development of America since its earliest days, and that a Catholic could be both a good citizen and a good Catholic.

However, anti-Catholicism persisted. In the 1920s, the Ku Klux Klan tried to stop Columbus Day celebrations and opposed Columbus statues simply because Columbus was a Catholic. We opposed the KKK then and have continued to stand up against bigotry directed at Catholics and others. We stood up against the persecution of Catholics in Mexico in the 1920s, spoke out for the Jews of Germany in the 1930s and worked for religious freedom behind the Iron Curtain during the Cold War. Today, we are rebuilding Christian communities in the Middle East that were targeted for genocide. Each of us can be proud of our history of standing up for the most vulnerable among us.

While our faith calls us to be respectful of different perspectives, acts of vandalism are crimes against all who cherish democracy and mutual respect. The Knights of Columbus remains firm in its condemnation of all forms of racism and violence, including political violence. With churches, statues, and religious symbols subject to vandalism and attack, we call upon elected officials and leaders at every level to defend the religious freedom of all.

Worthy FS Neil has quickly ensured that the required reporting forms have been submitted, and 75% of your Safe Environment requirement is complete. In addition, Msgr. Blessing Council already has one new member this year! While several other councils in our district have only achieved a fraction of this, your council is on a fast track to the Columbian award, and Star Council, great going!

The State Jurisdictional Meeting was held on July 18th. Although it was marred by technical difficulties, the main points were clear. Supreme want to convey to all members and councils that they are doing their best to listen, and implement suggestions coming from the bottom up. One of their goals is to increase the flow of communication in both directions. Fraternal webinars are available for you to watch online, and on demand. There will be a 4th Degree Exemplification on Sunday August 23rd at St. Theresa's Shrine in Burrillville. I've identified 3rd degree members from your council, and have submitted a list to the council leadership. If you are a 3rd degree Knight, I urge you to become a 4th degree, which includes Knighting with a sword and the right to wear the uniform as a color corps member.

Virtual Exemplifications are not only online, they are also on demand 24/7. So now you can join online, and once you've completed the online membership, you can connect to an on-demand exemplification. It's almost too easy! There are several new incentives this year too.

One of them, in celebration of Venerable Fr. McGivney's upcoming beatification in October, is that any brother who recruits 5 new members will receive a commemorative Fr. McGivney medallion.



Two final points; retention is key, so let's reach out to our brothers and ask how they are doing during this crisis, and see how we can help. This isn't the work of a retention committee, it's the first three principles of our order combined, and speaks to the promises we all took! It's the job of every one of us as Knights, and as good disciples of our Lord Jesus. In this same vein, all councils are urged to implement the "Leave no neighbor behind", and the "Into the Breach" Faith in Action programs.
