My Brother Knights,



With heavy hearts, we said farewell to Past State Deputy James Kiley, Sr., as he went to his final reward. He is with his beloved wife Angie now.

Brother Jim was a charter member of Msgr. Peter E. Blessing Council and was its second Grand Knight having served in the capacity during the 1963-64 Columbian Year. He also served as the council's Financial Secretary for many years. He also served as a Faithful Navigator, District Deputy and was the only Brother Knight from Blessing Council to serve as Rhode Island State Deputy during the 1990-91 Columbian Year.

Brother Jim was also a US Navy veteran of World War II serving as a Yeoman. Just after the war ended, he served on Admiral William "Bull" Halsey's staff prior to receiving his Honorable Discharge. He was very active in Coventry town politics as a longtime member of the Coventry Democratic Party.

On a personal note, he was a great friend and mentor to me as he lives on the next street over in my neighborhood. We went to many a "Knight Out" together, and during my term as Squires Chief Counselor, he came to many of our PawSox baseball games at McCoy Stadium. He was very supportive of our Squires Circle. I will truly miss Brother Jim.

SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S CHALLENGE November 2021



"Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." (Gospel for Nov. 7, Mk 12:43-44)

"Give until it hurts" might seem like a tired old cliché, but it has merit nonetheless. It's fairly easy to give from our excess — what we don't really need — but real sacrifice begins when we go beyond that. The widow in the parable, in giving what to many people would be a bit of loose change, offered a more meaningful gift than the wealthy who donated far larger sums they would hardly miss. But there's another layer of meaning here: Unlike the wealthy, the widow gave everything she had to God and put her trust completely in his divine providence. May we recognize that she made the wiser investment.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori: This month, I challenge you to review your charitable giving and to pray about whether God is asking you to contribute something more. Second, I challenge you to participate in your council's Food for Families or Coats for Kids Faith in Action program.

Questions for Reflection:

How does God wish you to balance providing for yourself and your family with serving others? Do you find you put your trust in material goods and wealth, rather than in God? What are some specific, concrete ways you might do better at sharing your blessings with the less fortunate?

"May the Lord bless you and keep you. May the Lord let his face shine on you and be gracious to you. May the Lord show you his face and bring you peace." - Numbers 6:24-26
