Ukraine has nine Knights of Columbus councils that began over two decades ago within the Knights of the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy. They help to provide community programs through their churches for all their people. Let us pray for peace in Ukraine.

On Monday, March 7th, the US Senate rejected a radical and deceptively named bill called "The Women's Health Act". This bill would create a new national standard, allowing for abortions of unborn children for virtually and reason and at any stage of pregnancy including up to birth. We are thankful for the bipartisan vote from the US Senate who defeated this terrible bill against pro-life in this country.

The Faith in Action Programs with wrap up its last scheduled event with the Good Friday Family Promotion on April 15, 2022, at all four churches we serve. Please remember to participate in as many parish activities including "Stations of the Cross". The 40 Days for Life begins March 2nd to April 10th, the state council invites any council to join the peaceful rosary prayer service at Planned Parenthood in Providence each Saturday morning during Lent. The Building the Domestic Church Kiosk in all four churches will continue throughout the remainder of the fraternal year. Also, members of our council will continue to volunteer at the SVDP soup kitchen on Saturday mornings at OLC church.

Please pray for peace in our country and throughout the world during this trying time and for an end to this pandemic.



SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S CHALLENGE March 2022



As they were about to part from him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good that we are here; let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." But he did not know what he was saying. ... Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." (Gospel for March 13, Lk 9:33, 35)

Having witnessed the Transfiguration, the three apostles did not want to leave the mountaintop. But as the vision ends, God's voice directs them back to Jesus, who takes them back down the mountain. We might wish in our own lives for extraordinary experiences or "spiritual highs," but even if we are granted such experiences, we are not meant to cling to them. Brothers, may we be grateful for these enriching moments, if and when they come, but remember that we fulfill our God-given mission primarily within the daily duties of our ordinary lives.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori: This month, I challenge you to withdraw from your normal routine each day to spend some time alone with God's word by reading and reflecting on the Gospels. Second, I challenge you to assist your council in planning for the Faith in Action Spiritual Reflection program.

Questions for Reflection:

Do you tend to seek one emotional religious experience after another, yet feel less motivated to live your faith in between these experiences? Do you recognize the Christian witness you must fulfill in your daily duties as a man, a husband, a father, and in your ordinary work and social interactions? Do you set aside time to participate in a spiritual retreat every now and then to reinvigorate your spiritual life?
