Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:





Departed Brother Knights









Over the past two months, we have had four Brother Knights go on to their final reward.

PGK Richard R. Belanger joined the order back in March 1955 marking over 68 years as a Knight. He and his wife Diane were usually in attendance at all our events. He served as Grand Knight of our council during the 1997-98 Fraternal Year. He was a parishioner at SS John and Paul Church serving in many capacities including the Parish Council and as a Eucharistic Minister. He was a US Navy Korean War era veteran. Brother Dick went to his final reward on September 12.

PDGK Alan A. Ogrodnik joined our council and our order back in August of 2011. He achieved full Knighthood not long after he joined our council. He served as our Deputy Grand Knight for two terms. You could always count on Brother Alan and his wife Ellen to attend all our activities! He was so devoted to our council that during his long illness which kept him at home, he continued to attend our meetings remotely via Zoom. Brother Alan also was a US Army veteran of the Vietnam War serving as a medic. He went to his final reward on September 1.

FDD/PGK Henry J. Garberg III was a charter member of our council joining the order when the council stood up in April 1962. He was the council's third Grand Knight serving during the 1964-65 Fraternal Year. He also served as District Deputy, and according to his obituary served as the State Chancellor. Brother Henry was also a US Air Force veteran. Some time ago, he moved down to Boca Raton, Florida, but kept in touch with some of his Brother Knights in our council. Brother Henry went on to his final reward on August 14.

Stelvio A. "Steve" Cordeiro was a US Army veteran of the Korean War. He was also a parishioner of SS John and Paul Church. He was an Honorary Life and Third Degree member of our council having joined in October 1992. Brother Steve went on to his final reward on August 2.
